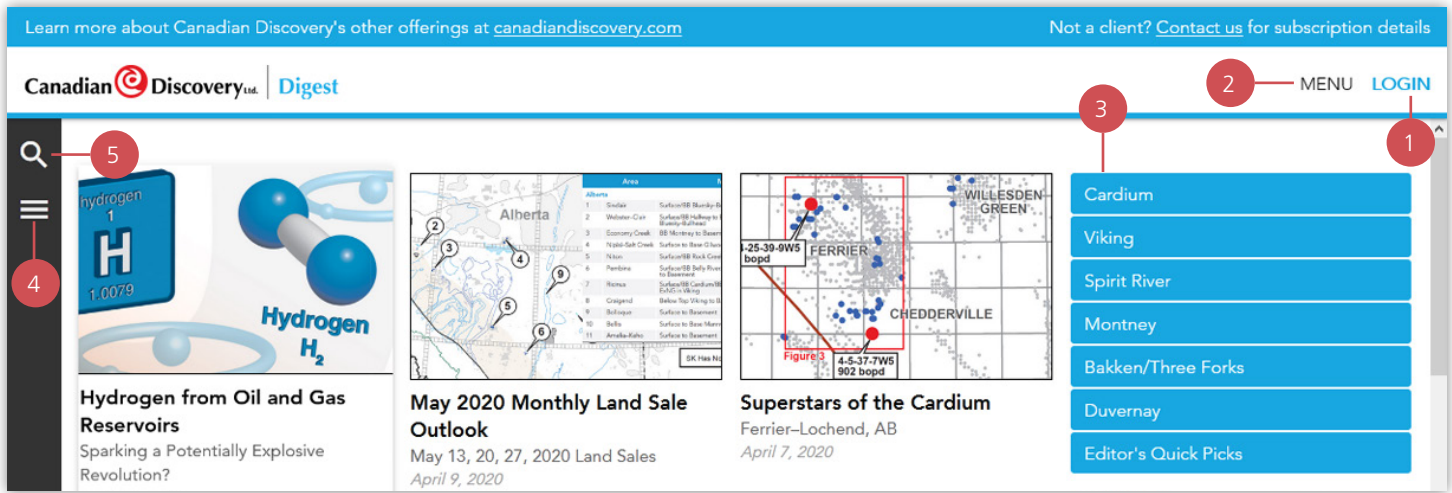

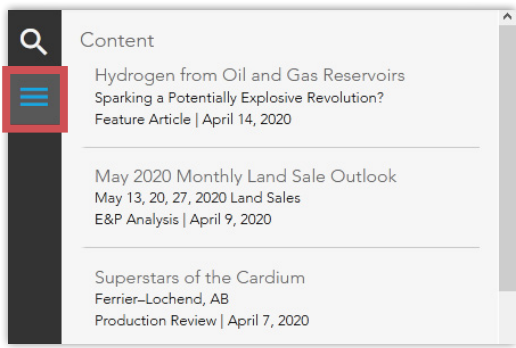


1 Login

Click the *MENU* link in the website header to access the FAQ section and various other information pages.

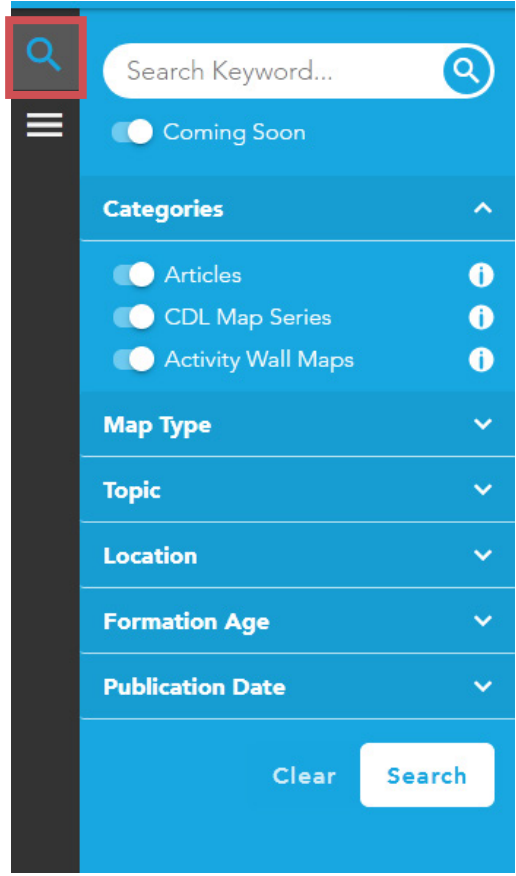
3 Play Group Quick Links
